EUROPEAN VETERAN CHAMPIONSHIPS - Regensburg, Bavaria, 17-20 May

June Johnson's postcard from Bavaria

A record breaking 1500 athletes from all over Europe entered the 10th European Veterans Non-Stadia Championships, which were held in Regensburg, Bavaria from 17th – 20th May.

Andrew and I flew out on Wednesday 16th and found our hotel was halfway between the town itself and the location of the 10km race, which was held on the following day. The venue was the Gewerbepark, which sounded all green and pleasant, but when we went there to register, we found it was a business/retail park. Registration was delayed by 20 mins or so as the 'chips' hadn't arrived. Another problem was the lack of a useful map, which meant that the locations for the X-C relays and the start of the Half-Marathon were not shown.

The next day, the roads were very quiet as it was a Bank Holiday, which meant a reduced transport system. This didn't help the runners, most of whom were staying in the town centre, as they then had a good half hour's walk to the park or had to take a taxi! Question: How many laps do you need to run round a business park to complete a 10km race? Answer: 9. It was very good for spectators, of course, but not ideal for the runners. It was also raining, so the tables laid out for post-race refreshments were sadly unused.

My race was at 14.50 and just as I finished there was a torrential downpour and it turned

very cold, so I was relieved I could jog back to the hotel to warm up and put on some dry clothes. But I didn't have the chance to chat to any of the athletes that I know from previous Championships which is what makes these events so friendly. Still I was pleased with my time of 46.42, the best for some years and I caught up with them later.

Friday was a day off for sightseeing and as it was dry and sunny, we took the opportunity to walk out of town along the River Danube to find the venue for the X-C relays. There had been much work done to tape the whole course and

I could see a steep, but short, hill which we would have to climb on every lap. We caught the bus back to town using our Athlete's passes.

Saturday was a lovely warm, sunny day and we enjoyed watching the Men's X-C races whilst waiting for the Ladies races. This recognised teams of 3 in 5 year age bands and I was part of the Silver medal-winning W60-64 team.

Sunday started already far too hot, even though the Half-Marathon began at 9.45, the temperature was to go up to 30°C and I knew I would have to be careful, especially on the first half of the out-and-back course. There were bands in the town itself and 'drumming' bands out on the route. Plenty of supporters and spectators were lining the route as there was also an Open Full Marathon and Half Marathon held at the same venue with different start times, as well as On-line Skating and Nordic Walking races. The atmosphere was very good and helped me along, but I was relieved to finish (my first Half-Marathon in 2 years) in 1:47.44. In both road races I was part of the Bronze winning W55-64 team.

After 3 races in 4 days, I was then able to relax and enjoy myself (and celebrate my birthday on the 19th) by spending the evening in a Beer garden by the river with the good company of 4 friends from Paddock Wood. *June Johnson*

SEVENOAKS AC JUNIORS

More competition available for junior athletes

The success of our recent Junior Events Evening highlights the fact that our juniors love the chance to compete. This year there is a distinct lack of opportunity for juniors as Tonbridge AC are not holding their usual monthly open meetings due to the rebuilding works going on at Tonbridge School. Also, we have not entered any teams in the Kent Young Athletes League, because we have nobody to run the teams.

The Kent Young Athletes League (KYAL) provides competition at Under 13 (school years 6 and 7) and Under 15 (school years 8 and 9) level and is open to various athletic clubs in Kent. Four meetings are held during summer months in four different locations in the county. Each meeting is on a Sunday and starts at about midday and goes on until about 5.00pm. A full range of running, throwing and jumping events is on offer.

Competing clubs must provide officials to help run the various events and team managers must be appointed, either one manager to run all four teams or separate managers for girls and boys. For the last few years I have run all the teams, but this year I had too many commitments elsewhere so was unable to take on this role. I hope someone will come forward to run the teams next year as the athletics meetings are great fun for both participants and spectators.

The Junior section needs to get organised now if they wish to enter teams for next year's KYAL. We need at least two qualified officials. Getting qualified entails attending a short course, usually held on a Saturday or Sunday in the Spring. Officials do not spend the whole time working at KYAL events. They are usually only on duty for an hour or so during the afternoon. Officials from other clubs are usually parents of athletes.

At most levels British athletics is very much run on a voluntary basis. Virtually all coaches, officials and judges work unpaid. I think they do it because they find it very rewarding. A month ago I was helping raise the bar in an U15 boys High Jump competition. It was a wonderful experience to be present as one lad took his Personal Best performance from 1 m 63cm to 1 m 77cm.

Please consider helping the junior section. It needn't be a massive commitment and it can be great fun. The more helpers we have, the easier it gets for everyone. We would love to offer more specialised coaching to the juniors so they can experience all athletics events. For this we need more help. Sevenoaks Five rewarded after pilgrimage to Canterbury

A tough half marathon — 13.1 miles - followed a week later by a 10 kilometre event contravenes the rule-of-thumb that one day of recovery is required after each mile of racing. But such was the scheduling of the most recent events in the Kent road running Grand Prix. Nevertheless, three Sevenoaks AC athletes had excellent runs in both races.

Sally Shewell, Carol Beadle and David Ives were joined by Scot Haggarty and Marion Middleton at Canterbury on Sunday 27 May for the Canterbury half marathon, which is part of the Kent Championships and was organised by Invicta East Kent AC.

450 runners had entered the challenging out and back course which started in Merton Lane, Canterbury and followed a scenic countryside course through the villages of Petham to Waltham and back. Even though it was pouring with rain, this did not deter supporters in the villages and along the course cheering on the competitors.

This was definitely not a course to record a personal best over, with one long hill approximately half way into the course and another extremely steep hill at the 10 mile mark, which proved to be too much for some who had to walk up it.

David Ives was first man home for the club in 01:18:59 in 7th overall place and 6th in the

Men's Kent Championship.

Scot Haggarty, just recovered from illness, did well to finish 187th in a time of 01:47:09.

Sally Shewell, first woman home for the club in 168th place in a time of 01:45:05 was 17th in the Women's Kent Championship and also 6th in the Ladies Masters 45-54 age group.

Carol Beadle was 177th in a time of 01:45:57 and 18th in the Women's Kent Championship.

Marion Middleton was 272nd in a time of 01:55:19 and 23rd in the Women's Kent Championship and also 2nd in the Ladies 55+age group.

KENT RR GP – BECKENHAM 10K Sunday 3 June

Shewell, Beadle and Ives were joined by Simon Hallpike for the Beckenham 10k around Beckenham Place Park. Unlike the Canterbury event, conditions were sunny and hot, which together with three notable hills, took the edge off the runners' finishing times.

Ives had another fine run for fifth place overall in 35:55, while Shewell was 3rd in the over-45 category (95th overall) with 45:48. Just two places behind Shewell (97th overall), Beadle was ninth in the over-35 category with 46:07. Hallpike finished 12th over-50 (77th overall) in 44:29.


At least the runners will have a little more rest before the next race in the series – the Thanet Marathon on September 2nd.

Anyway, back to the race, the winner was Henry Mountcastle of Hastings AC in a time of 34:24. Simon finished in 49:46 and I trailed in with 51:18, which is a PB, but then I

Afterwards we retired to the Rugby Club bar for tea and cakes and then snuck off home to make excuses. Running is a great way to keep fit. It's also a great excuse not to be somewhere. Trouble is, now I've written this, my cover is blown. I'll have to make sure my wife doesn't read it. You won't tell will you?

Alexia Taylor won the fifth race in the Sevenoaks Athletics Club 2007 Handicap Series by nearly two minutes.

Taylor took advantage of warm running conditions to improve her best time for the hilly five mile course by nearly six minutes, finishing in 48:05.

Alexia was followed home by the youngest competitor in the race, Nick Partridge, who also knocked a huge chunk out of his course personal best in recording 40:50. David Barley, another two minutes back in third, was another runner finding the weather to his liking as he recorded a new course best time of 38:08. David was almost caught by Heather Fitzmaurice, who was fastest woman on the day with 33:33. The fastest man was nearly two minutes further back in sixth: Andy Rackham showing a return to form with 32:51. Between these two in fifth, Simon Rowe continued to improve with 36:05.

The race attracted five newcomers to the handicap series including two who ran in the Sevenoaks Seven race earlier in the month. The series trophy goes to the runner with the best positions in their best four races. With last year's trophy winner, John Denyer, already missing three races this year, and the first five races producing five different winners, no clear contenders have yet emerged for the 2007 trophy.

The sixth race of the twelve race series is over the alternate 7 mile course and starts from the Sevenoaks School track at 7 pm on Tuesday 12th June.
